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# FOCUS ON...

## A DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN ADVOCATE & A COMMUNITY CONNECTOR

As I write this I am now in my in my final weeks with Communicare. I am so enjoying working with the centres.



Until February 2022 I was a senior chaplain with the Selwyn Foundation and lead Chaplain at Selwyn Village in Point Chevalier. I was a specialist in Dementia Care and Palliative Care. Late in 2022 Selwyn sold six of its seven Villages to MetLife Care. I was asked to care for the Selwyn Heights community as they grieved and adjusted to this change.

The next chapter in my life was more personal. I retired from the Selwyn Foundation on Good Friday 2022. The same weekend I "came out"

publicly as a trans woman. I presided at the Eucharist for the first time as "Nicola" on Easter Day. For the five years before that only family, colleagues and a few trusted friends knew I was a trans woman. I presented as a man at work. It became increasingly intolerable for me to live this double life and it was a huge relief, just over a year ago, to leave that behind. The Bishop issued a new license for me as "The Reverend Nicola Sian Frater" and, on May 8, 2022, appointed me as 1/4-time Priest in Charge of Selwyn Anglican Church in Mangere East.

As we age, we lose energy, strength, mobility, and independence. We can struggle to find meaning and purpose in life. Yet this is also a time in which we grow more and more to know and accept who we are and care less and less what others think. We shift from finding meaning in all the things we can do to finding meaning in simply being who we are in connection to loved ones and others. Staying connected becomes critical at a time when many of us lose connection to others. Keeping us connected with each other is what Communicare is about, and I am so happy to be part of Communicare as it evolves.

I look forward to being part of Communicare going forward and hope that we receive another generous grant to ensure this happens.

### FROM MINISTRY OF SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

# The Five Main Vulnerabilities for Older People

**1. Health.** Ability to get a doctor's appointment, to see the same doctor; cost, transport, follow up assessment and care.

**2. Housing.** Ability to look after own house and surrounds, rent cost, sharing with extended families, lack of housing for seniors (small, single storey).

**3. Financial.** Pension insufficient to cover rent, transport, general living cost and utilities without other income.

**4. Social.** Those living alone suffer loneliness due to peer deaths, lack of transport and inability to travel due to health reasons. Family may have moved away or overseas. Quite a few do not have digital skills which may also have a detrimental effect.

**5. Access.** The ability to move around easily to travel, shop and visit friends is severely curtailed by impediments to mobility devices, sight, hearing. All of the above are to some degree inter-related and many older people are affected by more than one, ethnicity also varies the effect of each vulnerability as does mental health.

#### **Graphical Breakdown**


To support the Governments Life Strategy Action Plan 2021- 2024 MSD partnered with SWA and MoH regarding older people's vulnerability in NZ.

#### Results shown below.

54% are OK; breakdown of rest is below. 33% experience vulnerability in a single domain 13% experience vulnerability in two or more Auckland, Gisborne and the West Coast have highest proportion of multiple vulnerabilities.
